

The Ultimate Rain Day Guide for Coastal Acres Campers

Don't let a little North Atlantic mist dampen your spirits! From world-class art to maritime history, here is how to spend a perfect rainy day indoors while camping at Coastal Acres Campground in Provincetown, MA.

Art & Culture (Stay Inspired and Dry)

- Provincetown Art Association and Museum (PAAM): Located at 460 Commercial St. (508-487-1750), this is the "must-visit" cultural hub. They offer incredible rotating exhibits, concerts, and even adult and kids' classes if you're feeling creative.
- Fine Arts Work Center: Head to 24 Pearl St. (508-487-9960) to see where the magic happens. Check their schedule for readings, workshops, and gallery exhibits featuring fellows from around the world.
- Castle Hill Truro Center for the Arts: A short drive away at 10 Meetinghouse Rd. (508-349-7511), they offer fantastic exhibits and hands-on classes for both kids and adults.

History & Discovery

- Provincetown Public Library: Visit 356 Commercial St. (508-487-7094) to see the jaw-dropping 62-foot half-scale model of the Rose.Dorothea fishing schooner built right inside the building. They offer free internet, local art exhibits, and plenty of quiet corners to read.
- Pilgrim Monument & Provincetown Museum: High on the hill (508-487-1310), the museum offers fascinating history on the Mayflower's arrival. If there's a break in the rain, the views from the top are unbeatable.
- Center for Coastal Studies: Located at 5 Holway Ave. (508-487-3622), they offer fascinating lectures and exhibits about our local marine life and whale rescue efforts.

National Seashore & Sightseeing

- Province Lands Visitor Center: Your go-to for all things nature (508-487-1256). Watch films about the dunes, browse the indoor exhibits, and grab maps for the 8 miles of bike trails and nature walks for when the sun peeks out.
- Highland Lighthouse & Museum: Located off Route 6 in North Truro (508-487-3997), this iconic lighthouse offers a great museum to explore while waiting for the clouds to clear.

Rainy Day Tours (Let Someone Else Drive!)

- Art's Dune Tours: Located at 4 Standish St. (508-487-1950). Their SUVs keep you dry while you take in a narrated tour of the majestic dunes and lighthouses.
- Trolley Tours: Hop on the Mayflower Trolley (508-487-8687) at MacMillan Pier or the Provincetown Trolley (508-487-9483) in front of Town Hall for a covered, narrated tour of the town's best sights.
- Discover Provincetown: For a more intimate experience, try their 6-passenger narrated tours (508-487-1468).

A Little "Spirit" Brightener

- Truro Vineyards: Located at 11 Shore Rd. (508-487-6200). There is nothing better than a wine tasting or a visit to their distillery shop to make you forget all about the puddles outside!

Pro Tip: Most of these locations are just a short trip from the campground. Grab your raincoat and enjoy the quiet, cozy side of Cape Cod!
